
#### **National Volunteer Week**

We are in our third year as Acres for Hamiota (AFH) and our committee is busy planning plant 2023. We have rented land from Neil Mathison for the last three years. Thanks Neil!

AFH is pleased to welcome Haily Johns, a grade 10 student, as a new board member. Haily will provide a valuable contribution to AFH's

activities in 2023. Following the great success of Ag in the Classroom last year, AFH's education coordinator Laura Cowling is preparing again for this year's program.

In an effort to get new project ideas, idea cards were available at the Appreciation Evening last December, and invited people to contribute ideas. Lots of interesting ideas came from the cards. The miniature golf idea emerged from this concept. Yes, you heard that right, a miniature golf course will be coming to Hamiota Municipal Park next year. Another new project that we are excited about is the purchase of speed signs for both the north and south entrances into town. Our committee has been working on projects that will have a positive impact on a wide range of people, such as recreation, health, and safety initiatives. In an effort to thank the public for their overwhelming support, we intend to explain where the funds have been spent thus far.

To date AFH has assisted

Hamiota Fire Department -\$15,000.00. \$10,000 to assist with the purchase of a 3/4-ton truck used for various tasks including to pull the Stars Ambulance fuel trailer and \$5000.00 to assist with lights, radios and decals.

Hamiota & District Sports Complex—\$8,000.00 for stainless steel counter tops in the kitchen.

Mid-West Arts Council -\$2,500.00 for improvements to the studio room upstairs at the Heritage Arts Centre.

Hamiota Aquatic Center—\$9,500.00 to purchase a boiler for heating the pool.

AED Program—\$1500.00 -AED for Hamiota Fire Department

Plus \$3500.00 of matched money for AEDs in the municipality at Redfern Farm Services, Knight Seeds, Hamiota Feedlot, Murray Seeds, Chappell Ag, Ventures and one is ordered for the 55+ Centre.

### Friendly Reminders from Yellowhead RCMP

With the snowmobiling season is coming to an end, the Yellowhead RCMP wants to remind residents once again that snowmobiling on private lands (including farms) without the permission of the owner/operator is prohibited.

Section 32(1) of The Off-road Vehicle Act prohibits the use of off-road vehicles (including snowmobiles) from operating on privately owned land without consent and carries a fine of \$237.00.

Before going for a rip, take a look at the maps of the snowmobile trails and always be mindful of signs indicating private property while riding. See you on the trails and have fun!

While you may be fawn'd of the deer, remember not to feed them. Feeding deer attracts predators, increases vehicle collisions, and can even lead to health effects for the deer due to winter changes in their digestive system. While they are cute and fun to see, they are still wild animals and should be treated as such. Buck the trend and don't feed the deer!
