GRANT APPLICATIONS

*We make our Grant Applications available to community groups at the beginning of each year with recipients announced in early spring. Over the years many organizations have reaped the benefit of the Foundation granting program including the Archery Club, Minor Ball, Drama Club, Pioneer Museum, Cornerstone Church, Park Residence, Hamiota United Church, Hamiota Aquatic Centre, Mid-West Arts Council and many more. Stay tuned for grant application notices in the Leader each January and please share this funding opportunity with our community groups.

SCHOLARSHIPS

*Each year the Foundation sets aside grant money to award two scholarships for graduating Hamiota Collegiate Institute students. Since 2008 the Foundation has awarded over \$113,000 in grant money back to local community organizations.

OUR WORK IN

2022 - The Foundation's Managed Endowment Fund, on October 31, 2022, reported in at \$442,500 and provided a total of \$22,600 in grants. \$4,100 to Hamiota Fire Department for the purchase of specialized Emergency Response Equipment, \$2,500 to Villages United Early Learning Centre to complete maintenance & upgrades to the outdoor play spaces, \$5,000 to Hamiota Centennial Library to build a reading gazebo, \$500 to Decker Country Riders 4-H Club to host an interclub equine clinic on May Long Weekend, \$1,000 to Mid-West Arts Council Inc. towards holding three summer community music concerts, \$5,000 to Hamiota Minor Ball for the purchase of new baseball uniforms, and \$3,500 to Recreation Hamiota for the purchase of either a cement ping-pong or foosball table. \$2,500 in grant funds managed by the Hamiota Collegiate's "Youth-In-Philanthropy" Group and was split between Recreation Hamiota, Hamiota Collegiate & Mid-West Arts Council and two Scholarships of \$500 were awarded to deserving graduates Kate-Leigh Heapy & Machaela Tannas.

2022 - HAMIOTA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION RECEIVES MANY DONATIONS FROM MULTIPLE SOURCES EACH YEAR. WE RECEIVED \$1,893.87 IN DONATIONS THROUGH THE DONORS CHOICE CAMPAIGN, \$1,730 IN "IN MEMORY" & MISC. DONATIONS.
THIS YEAR WE WERE ABLE TO HOLD OUR ANNUAL LUNCHEON AT THE HAMIOTA COMMUNITY CENTRE DURING THE ENDOW MB GIVING CHALLENGE. APPROXIMATELY 80 RESIDENTS ATTENDED, AND DONATIONS WERE GRACIOUSLY ACCEPTED WITH OUR GIFTS RECEIVED TOTALLING \$7,900 AND EARNING US A TOTAL OF \$3,160 IN STRETCH FUNDS FROM THE WINNIPEG FOUNDATION AND THE MANITOBA GOVERNMENT.






Hamiota 55+ Centre & R Store
