# Hamiota & Area Community Alliance



*The Hamiota & Area Community Alliance is working to improve our community through careful planning and strong partnerships, helping to make our area a better place for everyone.*

The Plans for the Hamiota 12-plex are continuing to move forward in the planning phase. The Building and Development Committee have been helping with the 12-plex. The design is still in the works; however, an initial draft plan includes spacious two-bedroom, one-and-a-half- bath units which are all on one level to make for easy accessibility. The complex offers many great features including indoor parking and a common room which makes for an awesome space for socialization and relaxation. Located in a convenient spot on Maple Avenue, it is ideally situated for easy access to local amenities. Spurred on by the Hamiota & Area Community Alliance a study regarding the feasibility of this 12-unit residential complex located near downtown Hamiota is underway.

An important note about this project is that it is not at all owned by the Alliance. A private corporation will be established with an independent ownership group. Investors are still required, and no formal investment commitments need to be made at this point. Anyone interested in becoming an investor can contact Bill Gardham at 204-748-5258 to have a confidential one-to-one discussion about the project. The project is not guaranteed to move forward. The design plans are not finished but are currently being used for determining the cost of the project. The final designs and rental prices will be decided by the investor group. The current rental prices are just estimates used for conversation purposes and cannot be finalized until construction prices are finalized.

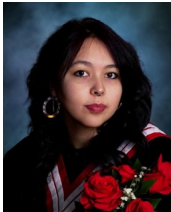

This complex is not in competition with Park Residence or Lilac. These buildings should each be viewed as complementary to one another. There have been some people that have expressed interest in becoming tenants in the 12-plex, it has not been determined that it will be exclusively a 55+ facility. This decision will be made by the investor group.

Other communities have had great success with these types of ventures and the need for housing in Hamiota is obvious. There are a limited number of houses on the market. This project is going to alleviate the housing shortage and hopefully spur future projects in the future. In the course of time, the Alliance will work with those interested in developing housing like condos, apartments, duplexes, single-family homes etc. They will use this learning to assist wherever they can lend a hand.

The lifestyle committee is currently planning a safety meeting that will be held in June. Watch the community centre sign for updates!

## Young Riders Hone Skills at May Long 4-H Horsemanship Clinic

Over the May Long Weekend, the Decker Country Riders 4-H Club hosted the May Long 4-H Horsemanship Clinic at MC Equine Arena near Strathclair, MB. Held May 17 and 18, the two-day clinic brought together young horse enthusiasts aged 7 to 16 from across the Southwest and South Parkland regions, including members from several 4-H clubs as well as participants registered as Buddies of 4-H. A total of 17 riders took part, including 11 members from the Decker Country Riders, along with representatives from Prairie Spurs Equine 4-H, Graysville Light Horse and Pony, and the Southwest Area. Three aspiring 4-H members also joined as Buddies of 4-H, taking advantage of this opportunity to learn more about horsemanship and the 4-H experience. The clinic featured expert instruction from Jessica Reid of North Star Farm, located just outside Virden along the Assiniboine River. Jessica led participants through four mounted sessions focused on horsemanship, balance, and rider-horse communication. Riders also attended four hands-on classroom sessions covering tack cleaning, equine colour genetics, leg and hoof bandaging, and medication and vaccination protocols. A special guest, Jocelyn Kish of Top Spot

Stables, joined the clinic to share her personal story—a life-changing riding accident and how wearing a helmet saved her life. Her inspiring message emphasized the importance of safety and left a lasting impression on everyone present. Despite cool and windy weather, spirits remained high and enthusiasm never waned. The event was made possible through generous support from the Hamiota Community Foundation, whose funding ensured participants could access high-quality instruction and resources in a safe, supportive environment. The weekend offered more than just riding skills—it fostered learning, resilience, safety awareness, and the kind of friendships that make 4-H special. With dedicated instructors, engaged youth, and a shared passion for horses, the May Long 4-H Horsemanship Clinic was a resounding success.

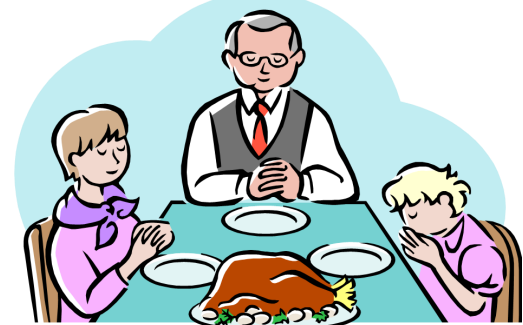

# Handi-Van News

**T**he Handi-Transit Board was established to oversee the operation of the Handi-Vans. The present Board consists of Graham Jamieson, Ross Gray, Doreen Knight, Karen Powell, Helen Sheridan and Leslie Toovey. Marla Edmundson attends our meetings and provides information to the Board that assists us in decision making. Gwenda Skayman assists in billing duties.

Over the last 6 months we have been busy going over operations and discussing the need to replace one of our units. Both units are getting older and the milage is climbing. We are looking at a 9-passenger unit; an in between capacity of the 2 vans we currently have. The present smaller unit is very cramped for wheelchair clients and difficult for drivers to maneuver, getting clients in and wheelchairs hooked up. A 9-passenger unit can be driven by the driver with a class 5 license, where the 12-passenger requires the driver to have a class 4 or higher license.

We are looking at 2 different units, both with some larger seats and capacity to handle larger wheelchairs. Our smaller unit is not able to transport clients with oversized wheelchairs. The new units will allow drivers to stand up in them, provide more space, making it easier to assist clients in safe seating securement; as the new units have more up to date safety features and restraints.

With that being said, we are looking at approxi-

mately \$200,000.00 and the Hamiota Recreation Director, Mason has been working hard looking into government grants and he has applied for one that may cover 80% of our cost. When we obtain funds and decide on which unit to purchase, putting a deposit down will provide delivery of the new unit in 3 to 6 months.
