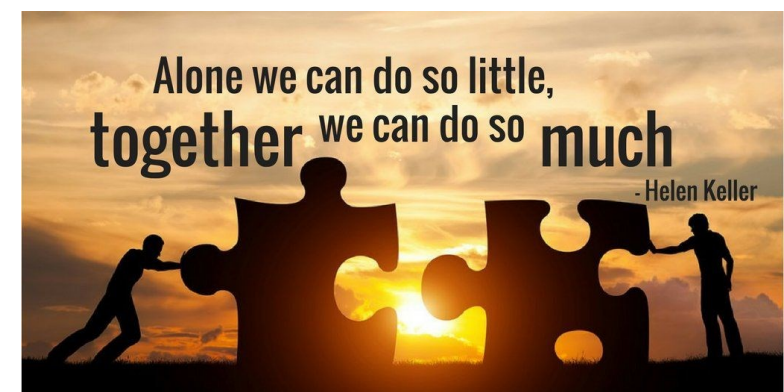
The alliance was also extremely fortunate to have key players from the Shared Health out to visit the facility and discuss priorities on June 28th.

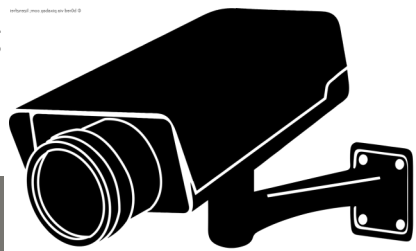

Security Camera Rebate Program

Thanks to a grant by the **Hamiota Community Foundation, the Hamiota Chamber of Commerce** is rolling out a Security Camera Rebate Program for any business or community group in located within the Town of Hamiota to help prevent crime in our community and to aid the RCMP in helping to solve any cases. This program's focus will be on EXTERIOR cameras, as it helps the community as a whole.

The Hamiota Chamber of Commerce with the financial support of the Hamiota Community Foundation is offering any business or community group:

- \$100 per security camera located in a new EXTERIOR location added onto their existing security system – up to 4 cameras (locations to be approved)
- 50% Cost Sharing (up to a \$500 rebate) towards installing a NEW security system in a location where one does not already exist – with minimum of 2 EXTERIOR cameras (locations to be approved)

Camera systems MUST be at minimum

- 4k Resolution
- Weatherproof
- Colour Enhanced Night Vision
- Must be installed by the end of 2025

Businesses or Community Groups

- are responsible for collection of the images and maintenance of their system
- would ensure that cameras and locations are made known to the RCMP and will agree to share the images collected with RCMP upon request to help with any investigations
- are required to display a “Warning – Security Cameras” Sign

A binder with a map of the location of cameras would be compiled and a copy shared with the Yellowhead RCMP. If you currently have exterior cameras (business or residential) and would be willing to have your camera location be included in the binder, it would also help to keep our community safer. The more comprehensive this resource is, the more valuable it will be. Please contact Dave Rawlings as 204-764-0351 to be included.

2025 Tractor Trek Sets New Records

Thirty-one tractors and drivers made the trek from Rivers via the Provincial Campgrounds to Clack's Museum six miles northwest of Rivers. Following visiting and refreshments the trekkers returned to Rivers. The Trek raised five thousand thirty dollars and sixty cents for the Hamiota Hospital District Foundation Chemo Unit. This amount is higher than in Rivers Banner because we received what we believe is the final donation today.

Redfern Farm Services in Rivers let us use their facilities to register for the trek and line the tractors up plus give us financial support to cover expenses for the day. Rivers Heritage Co-op also supports the event so that every cent received goes directly to the Chemo Unit.

This year Joanne Boyd Senior Advisor for Forever donated two blankets to auction off with all funds going to the Chemo Unit. Gordon Allan, a big supporter of Trek, bought the first blanket for three hundred dollars. He then donated the blanket to the Chemo Unit for use there. Josh Krahn bought the second blanket for three hundred dollars.

J Embroidery (Judy Hart), Brookdale Manitoba donated two ball caps with Rivers Tractor Trek Logo to auction. They were purchased by Sophia Berard and Evan Smith each of them paying forty dollars.

Waves of Hope Dragon Boat Racers donated a basket of gifts to raffle off and tickets sold raised five hundred and eighty dollars. Waves of Hopes support is very much appreciated.



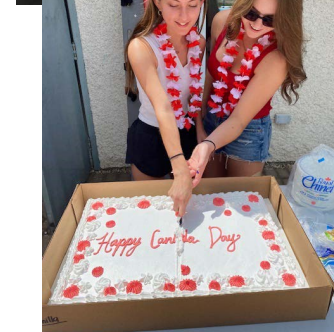

Every cent counts in keeping services in our area.

Without the tractor enthusiasts taking hours preparing their tractors for the trek this event would not be possible. Tom Ryall supplied six drivers with tractors from his collection plus drove one himself.

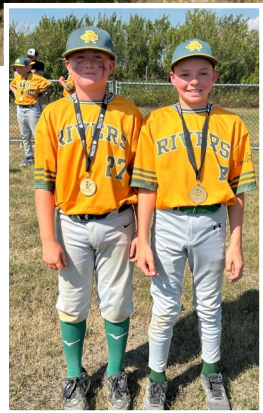

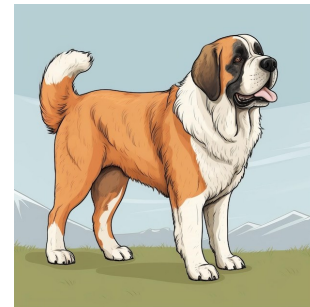
We will all miss seeing them, and Jasper, out on their daily walks and we wish them nothing but good health and happiness in their new community.

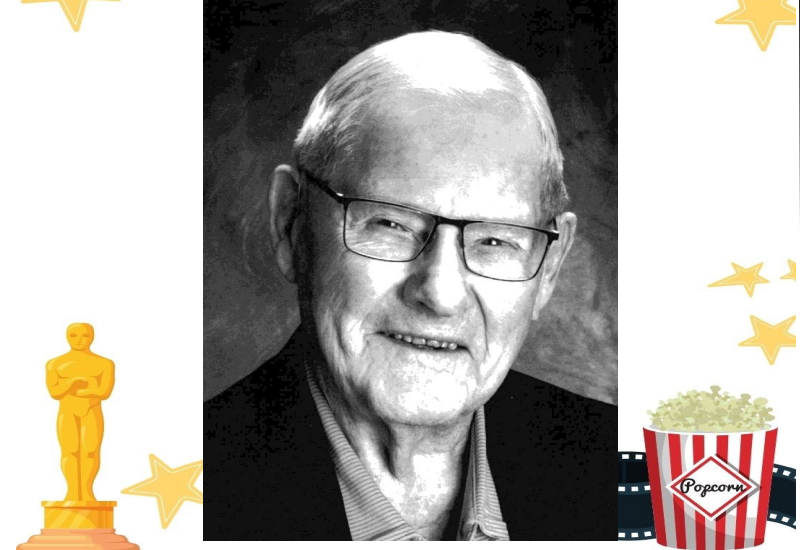

HONORARY LIFE MEMBER

Al Robertson, Hamiota, MB.



AL Robertson was a member of several teams inducted into the Manitoba Baseball Hall of Fame and of one team inducted into the Saskatchewan Baseball Hall of Fame. In 2000 he was inducted into our Hall of Fame as an individual, in recognition of his outstanding accomplishments as a player, coach and administrator. In 2009 he was inducted along with his wife Lorna and sons Jeff and Randy as a family in our special category. The Robertsons were a main reason Hamiota was recognized as the Baseball Capital of Manitoba. His work on behalf of our Hall of Fame is now recognized in the Honorary Life Membership. Al was an original director of the Hall of Fame, and he remained a director until 2022. He was a regular contributor of nominations. He and his wife Lorna worked annually at our banquet ticket desk. Al was also a very important member of the Selection Committee. His knowledge of contributions made to baseball by people from all over the Province were crucial to this Committee's credibility.

Mayor's Volunteer Recognition

This Month in my recognition of volunteers in our Community I have two very well deserving people to recognize. When you talk about Minor Ball in Hamiota a lot of names come to mind. Our tradition in this goes back a long way and we are known as the Baseball Capital of Manitoba (at least unofficially). People like Al Robertson who was just named as a Lifetime Member of the Manitoba Baseball Hall of Fame come to mind as real builders.

Hamiota Show n' Shine Car Show

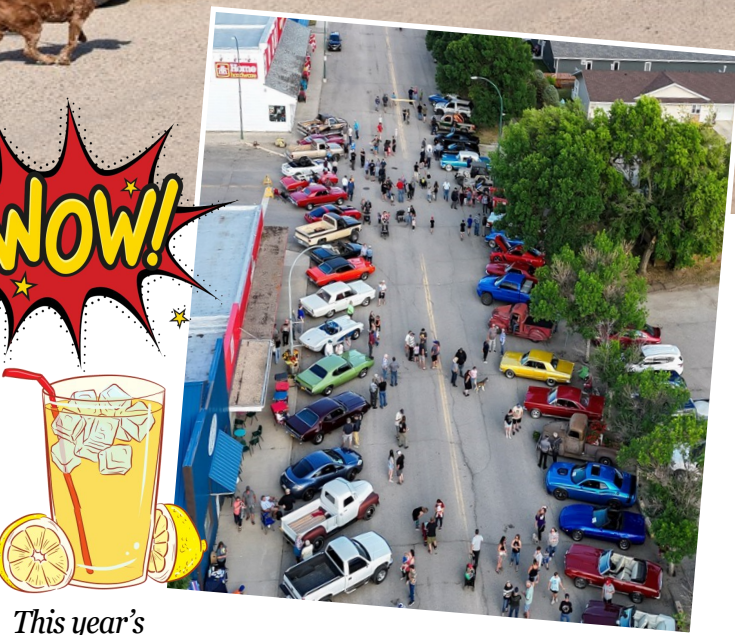
A Fantastic Evening Downtown!
