Security Camera Rebate Program

rolling out a Security Camera Rebate Program for any business or community group in located within the Town of Hamiota to help prevent crime in our community and to aid the RCMP in helping to solve any cases. This program's focus will be on EXTERIOR cameras, as it helps the community as a whole.

The Hamiota Chamber of Commerce with the financial support of the Hamiota Community Foundation is offering any business or community group:

- \$100 per security camera located in a new EXTERI-OR location added onto their existing security system - up to 4 cameras (locations to be approved)
- 50% Cost Sharing (up to a \$500 rebate) towards installing a NEW security system in a location where one does not already exist – with minimum of 2 EX-TERIOR cameras (locations to be approved)

Camera systems MUST be at minimum

- 4k Resolution
- Weatherproof
- Colour Enhanced Night Vision
- Must be installed by the end of 2025

Businesses or Community Groups

- · are responsible for collection of the images and maintenance of their system
- would ensure that cameras and locations are made known to the RCMP and will agree to share the images collected with RCMP upon request to help with any investigations
- · are required to display a "Warning Security Cameras" Sign

A binder with a map of the location of cameras would be compiled and a copy shared with the Yellowhead RCMP. If you currently have exterior cameras (business or residential) and would be willing to have your camera location be included in the binder, it would also help to keep our community safer. The more comprehensive this resource is, the more valuable it will be. Please contact Dave Rawlings as 204-764-0351 to be includ-



hirty-one tractors and drivers made the trek from Rivers via the Provincial Campgrounds to Clack's Museum six miles northwest of Rivers. Following visiting and refreshments the trekkers returned to Rivers. The Trek raised five thousand thirty dollars and sixty cents for the Hamiota Hospital District Foundation Chemo Unit. This amount is higher than in Rivers Banner because we received what we believe is the final donation today.

Redfern Farm Services in Rivers let us use their facilities to register for the trek and line the tractors up plus give us financial support to cover expenses for the day. Rivers Heritage Co-op also supports the event so that every cent received goes directly to the Chemo Unit.

This year Joanne Boyd Senior Advisor for Forever donated two blankets to auction off with all funds going to the Chemo Unit. Gordon Allan, a big supporter of Trek, bought the first blanket for three hundred dollars. He then donated the blanket to the Chemo Unit for use there. Josh Krahn bought the second blanket for three hundred dollars.

J Embroidery (Judy Hart), Brookdale Manitoba donated two

ball caps with Rivers Tractor Trek Logo to auction. They were purchased by Sophia Berard and Evan Smith each of them paying forty dollars.

Waves of Hope Dragon Boat Racers donated a basket of gifts to raffle off and tickets sold raised five hundred and eighty dollars. Waves of Hopes support is very much appreciated.

Clack's Museum board and staff has opened their doors for us the past four years as the destination of the trek putting in numerous hours setting up tables etc. for our use that day. A new volunteer at the trek commented that Clack's Museum is a hidden gem we should promote more. Clack's Museum is having their Open House August 10 details will be advertised. I'm sure.

Harry Airey and Tom Ryall plan the route each year trying to include some new scenery to the trek. Kaylee Hatley kindly took photographs this year and we have had a couple of other people share photographs with us. The past two years we have had a book printed containing photographs of all the drivers and tractors plus other interesting information pertaining to the trek.

Someone asked how we raise so much money when we only ask for a \$25 donation from drivers. Some drivers donate large sums of money to the trek for the chemo unit plus generous citizens donate through the trek to the chemo unit. This year Lorne Green asked if the campers could pass a bucket around for donations. We said if they wanted to, we would make sure the money got to the chemo unit. Every cent counts in keeping services in our area.

Without the tractor enthusiasts taking hours preparing their tractors for the trek this event would not be possible. Tom Ryall supplied six drivers with tractors from his collection plus drove one himself.
