Fusion Credit Union Commits \$56,000 to Eight Community Projects Through Full Circle Fund



August 10, 2026 - Hamiota, Manitoba – Community organizations are turning great ideas into reality with support from Fusion Credit Union's Full Circle Fund. Following its latest intake, Fusion has committed a total of \$56,000 to eight community organizations, providing support to projects that will have lasting benefits for residents.

École St. Lazare will receive \$20,000 to support the development of a new school and community fitness area, providing students and residents with greater access to health and wellness opportunities. In addition, Fusion is committing \$20,000 to

Lil Eagles Nursery School in Ethelbert for the development of a new playground for children to learn, play and grow.



The Full Circle Fund was established to support community projects that require larger donations. Applications are accepted year-round and reviewed twice annually, on April 1 and October 1, ensuring organizations have ongoing opportunities to access funding for impactful initiatives.

AGRISTABILITY ENHANCEMENTS FOR MANITOBA PRODUCERS AFFECTED BY WEATHER EVENTS AND FLOODING

Manitoba producers impacted by significant early summer rains and resulting flooding in June and July 2026 may be eligible for the following AgriStability enhancements:

- waiving the 2025 application late filing penalty
- increasing the 2026 interim payment rate from 50% to 75%
- late participation for 2026

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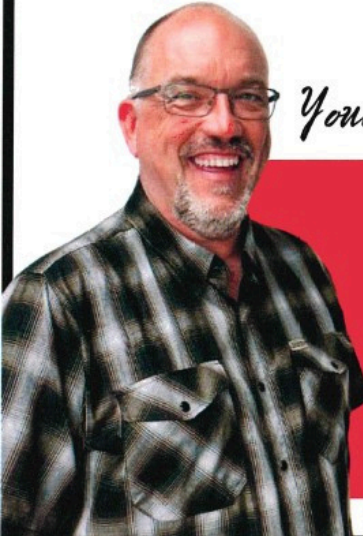

Directions: Travel 7 miles south, then turn west — you will see us!

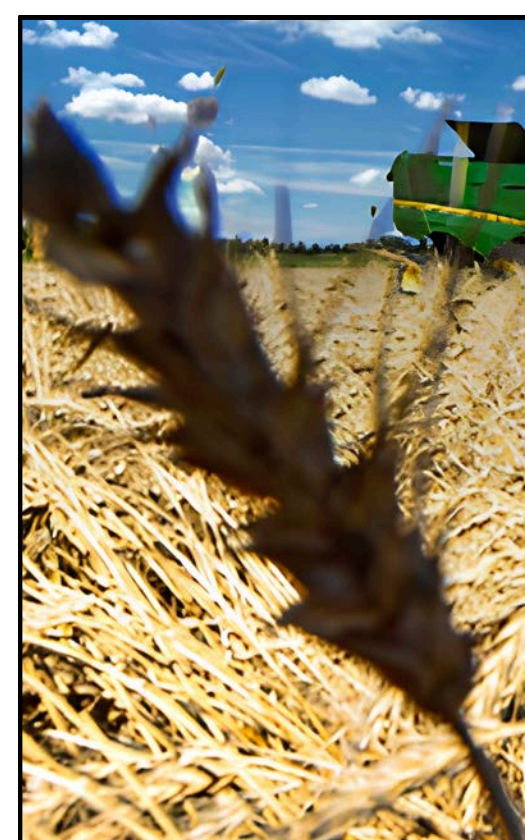
Plans are underway for another great opportunity to bring our community together, celebrate agriculture, and enjoy the spirit of harvest season.

A LIFE WELL LIVED: HAMIOTA
REMEMBERS TOM SEDGWICK'S
LEGACY



Sedgwick: Thomas Osborne Sedgwick, February 20, 1926 – August 15, 2026. In his 101st year, Thomas Osborne Sedgwick’s life journey ended on Saturday, August 15, 2026, at Birch Lodge Personal Care Home in Hamiota, Manitoba. He will be sadly missed by his daughters, Sandra Todd (Barry), Winnipeg, Marlene Smith (Allan), Hamiota; grandchildren, Stacey Wan (Carl), Ottawa,

Heather Todd, Winnipeg, Kent Smith (Yvonne), La Salle, and Michael Smith (Brandi), Brandon, along with great-grandchildren, Audrey and Colin Wan, Adrian Flett and Elena Todd, Kennedy and Mikaela Smith, and Emmett and Asher Smith. He was predeceased by his wife Eleanor; parents Emery and Agnes; his sisters Phyllis and Mary; and infant grandson, Mark Smith.

Tom was born February 20, 1926 in Minnedosa. His mother passed away when he was very young and his dad arranged for him to be raised by George and Lizzy Anderson at Hamiota. With the outbreak of World War II, Tom was determined to join the army and head overseas. As soon as he reached the age of 18, he enlisted and underwent basic training. However, by the time he turned 18 on February 20, 1944, the war was drawing to a close and he wasn’t posted overseas. His time in the army left him with a great appreciation for the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Legion. He was instrumental in the construction of the memorial wall at the Hamiota cenotaph. After leaving the army, he met his future wife, Eleanor. They were married in the evening of June 26, 1947 at Young United Church, Winnipeg. Five years later, Tom and Eleanor left their city jobs to pursue their dream of farming. They returned to the Hamiota area where Tom was raised. While farming Tom and Eleanor were a true partnership.

Tom excelled at crop production while Eleanor managed the farm accounts and household. Their success was built on a foundation of hard work and determination. Tom was adept at evolving to benefit from the new opportunities and technologies in agriculture. He loved to have the grandchildren come to visit, and they have fond memories of joining him on the tractor to help him with fieldwork.

Tom was active in municipal politics and served as a counsellor for the RM of Hamiota and Mayor of the Town of Hamiota. He was also dedicated to providing volunteer services to the community and drove the ambulance and

the Handi-van. He also drove school bus for many years. Tom always made time for coffee, which enabled him to monitor the pulse of the community. Tom and Eleanor were avid travellers and together they visited many parts of Canada as well as many countries in Europe and beyond, including their favourite destination of Australia, where they enjoyed extended winter vacations. In later years, Tom maintained his home in Hamiota - watering, mowing and spraying the weeds regularly until he was 98. He then moved into Birch Personal Care Home, where he matched wits with the staff on a regular basis. On February 20 of this year, Tom celebrated his 100th birthday with his family in attendance. At about the same time, Tom received the Royal Canadian Legion Centenary Medal.

A celebration of Tom’s life will be held at the Hamiota Community Hall on Tuesday, August 25, 2026, at 2:00 P.M., with interment at the Hamiota cemetery. Kent Smith reflected on Tom’s life, Heather Todd did a reading and Michael Smith carried his urn to its final place of rest in the cemetery. Campbell Funeral Home capably and compassionately managed the arrangements. The family extends special thanks to the staff of Birch Lodge for their compassionate care. The family of Tom "T.O." Sedgwick wishes to thank the Hamiota community for the outpouring of love following his passing on August 15, 2026, at age 100.

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PROVINCE PROVIDES ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON FLOOD RECOVERY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Many Manitoba residents, businesses, and organizations are continuing their recovery efforts following the flooding that occurred between June 6 and July 1. To support those affected, the Province of Manitoba is providing financial assistance through the Manitoba Flood Recovery Program (MFRP) and the Disaster Financial Assistance (DFA) program.

For homeowners impacted by basement flooding, a new Rapid Residential Assessment Model has been introduced to help speed up the assessment process and deliver financial assistance more quickly. This approach allows eligible residents to receive initial payments sooner, helping them begin cleanup, repairs, and restoration work without unnecessary delays.

Most eligible applicants have already received an initial \$500 payment. Residents are encouraged to submit photos, receipts, invoices, estimates, and other supporting documentation as soon as possible to ensure their claims can be processed efficiently. Assistance may be available for basement restoration, essential household items, and certain flood-damaged building components.

Support is also available for farms, small businesses, non-profit organizations, municipalities, and other local authorities through the Disaster Financial Assistance program. These programs are designed to help communities restore essential services, repair damaged infrastructure, and support long-term recovery.

Anyone affected by the flooding is encouraged to learn more about available assistance and application requirements. Together, we can help our neighbours recover, rebuild, and move forward stronger than before.

 - d) a refusal by an assessor to amend the assessment roll under subsection 13(2).
